Do You Have a Clear View?

hanks to Mary Anderson, your answer can be an emphatic "Yes," whenever you get asked, "Do you have a clear view?" as you drive through rain or snow. And, thanks to continued improvements and technological advances, you'll continue to see better than ever.

Anderson was visiting New York City in the early part of the last century and is said to have noticed how the driver of the trolley car she was on continually opening the window to clean off the snow so he could see out the front of the car. The Birmingham, Alabama resident was inspired to

the front of the car. The Birmingham, Alabama resident was inspired to invent a device -- a lever attached to a rubber blade -- that a trolley driver could operate as they drove to wipe their window clean.

Thus, the windshield wiper was born. Anderson is said to never have earned

any money from her invention, and it wasn't until 1922 that Cadillac made

windshield wipers standard equipment. But, over the years, wiper

technology has changed and improved.

Today, truckers and their companies' maintenance departments have plenty of wipers from which to choose. But, the most important aspect of windshield wiper maintenance is replacing blades before it's too

late.

Ideally, checking your truck's windshield and wipers are basic — and important — parts of the pre-trip inspection process suggested by the Department of Transportation. The DOT says of your windshield:

• Check for damage and clean if dirty

- spring tension
- Check wiper blades for any damage, "dead"
 rubber, and securement to arm






Of course, the most important reason to have a dash cam in your truck is in the event of an accident you have proof of the incident and who was at fault. Without this footage the other driver can try to claim that you caused the accident even if you did not and you could be liable for all the damages and injuries unless you have the captured footage from the

accident.

Dash cams can also be used to report a careless driver that is endangering others on the road. As a professional truck driver who makes the road his office, you are well versed in the rules of the road and can also easily identify if another driver is placing others in jeopardy. Having the dash cam footage as evidence can prove their carelessness and assist in getting them off the road or presented with the proper fines.

Having your dash cam on and recording even when you are asleep in your truck or away from your vehicle is also a good practice. If you return to your truck and there is a dent on your fender you can view the footage to see what happened. Your camera can also capture those who might try to vandalize your truck or try to break in.



While we may all think it won't happen – dash cams can also assist in cases of potential insurance fraud. There are other drivers out there that purposely cause an accident and then try to blame the other driver in order to receive insurance money. They can fake an injury claiming it was sustained in the accident and then say you are responsible for the medical costs. Dash cams can prove the accident was not your fault as well as help to stop the person that committed the fraud from doing this to anyone else.



If you train other drivers, you maybe also find a dash cam useful to record what the trainee sees behind the wheel and then review with them after each training session to point out improvements or what they did well.



Garmin, Rand McNally and Cobra are a few brands that are available in most travel centers and offer a variety of features and pricing options. Many offer time and location tracking with geo tags that sync with your GPS providing information on when and where the footage occurred. Built-in microphones are great to have if you train other drivers or to record the conversation with law enforcement or the other driver involved in an accident. However, you will need to alert the person if you are recording them as many states have laws in place to protect the recording of individuals without their knowledge. Most models do include a memory card but make sure you check what type before purchase and if it is easily replaceable as you will often be asked to hand over the memory card to law enforcement. Various mounting options are also available – some models are small enough to be mounted on your windshield but make sure the one you select works for you and does not obstruct your view. 

individual baking trays. One large one for the turkey and stuffing, and two smaller ones for the green beans and apple crisp. Think one larger rectangle and two smaller squares.

Using heavy duty aluminum foil create

the stuffing with the recommended amount of water and butter. You can add in onions, peppers, nuts, eggs, fruit, or bacon if you wish. For better cooking and flavor limit add ins to one or two items. Set aside to use for stuffing the turkey. If you don't have or don't want to use a boxed stuffing mix, you can use dried stale bread cut into cubes or croutons. Use powdered seasonings like onion,

Empty a boxed stuffing mix into a medium size bowl or plastic container. Mix

garlic, salt, pepper, oregano, and celery seed to season your stuffing if you decide to use regular stale bread. You may also want to use a Tablespoon or two less of the water since when it cooks in the roaster the juices from the turkey create steam and add to the overall moisture of the meal. For the turkey I bought turkey breast slices. It is

is uncooked turkey slices, not cooked lunch meat. Though honestly, you could use several layers of turkey lunch meat/deli slices if that is all you are able to find. Just adjust your cooking times. Season the turkey on both sides. Place one heaping spoonful of stuffing in the center of one slice of turkey. Roll up the turkey slice or fold the edges in like a burrito, (which ever you prefer) and secure with a toothpick. Place in

turkey breast sliced thick like a ham steak. You



the large foil baking tray inside the roaster. You can fill in any extra space around the turkey wraps with extra stuffing. Any that doesn't fit, you can cook by itself in the RoadPro crockpot or lunchbox, or even your microwave. In a bowl or cup mix in a handful of quick oats, a Tablespoon of cold butter cut into pieces, a spoonful of flour, a spoonful of brown sugar, and a few dashes of cinnamon and nutmeg. Using a fork or your fingers quickly

mix until it resembles a course ground meal texture. Sprinkle on top of the

Getting Saucy Making your own cranberry sauce is easy with dried cranberries (Craisins),


like it), a pinch of salt, and even a spoonful of orange juice if you have it on hand. Cook for 20 minutes or so. To thicken add a spoon of cornstarch to a little bit of water, stir until dissolved then add to the cranberry sauce and let cook until thickened. If you like a little more tang to your cranberries you can add in a good squeeze of Dijon mustard to make a delicious cranberry mustard great for leftover turkey sandwiches! *Almost everything I used here can be found at a decent truck stop except for the sliced Turkey, which I got at Walmart.
